#### SHORT SYNOPSIS

Ti-Frè and Gran-Frè, two brothers of Haitian origin living in a Dominican Republic shantytown, struggle daily to survive. On a full moon night, desperation pushes them to steal from a plantation, where a mysterious beast prowls in the shadows of the banana trees.

# LONG SYNOPSIS

Ti-Frè and Gran-Frè, two brothers of Haitian origin, live in a shantytown in the Dominican Republic. Undocumented, they face relentless violence and the ever-present threat of deportation. Gran-Frè looks after Ti-Frè by working on a banana plantation and resorting to petty theft. But when the plantation denies him work, desperation forces him to take Ti-Frè along to steal what they need to survive. That night, under the glow of a full moon, a mysterious beast stalks the shadows of the banana trees.



#### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I'm delighted to present *Platanero*, a short film that blends social cinema with horror and fantasy. The film was shot in the Dominican Republic in the village where I grew up. I spent most of my childhood near a banana plantation that was close to a Haitian shantytown. Some of them worked on the plantation and we became friends. During these years, I noticed the growing tensions between Haitians and Dominicans in the Dominican Republic, and this left an indelible mark on me.

I believe that the world of the plantations and its Haitian workers is little known to the public, and I wanted to bear witness to their situation through the character of Ti-Frè, a young undocumented Haitian. To achieve this, I chose to shape a realistic social story tinged with Caribbean folklore, in which the figure of the werewolf, who terrified me as a child, plays a predominant role.

This shift towards genre cinema, guided both by the mystical aura emanating from the festive atmosphere of the Dominican Republic and by the fertile imagination of a young boy, allows the film's themes to be expressed in a truly unique way. I hope you'll be drawn into the world of *Platanero*.
